

# Getting Started with AI Sketchbook

## Introduction

AI sketchbook tool allows fashion designers to leverage AI technology to inspire creativity, streamline the workflow, and seamlessly transition from concept to virtual twin. The tool uses images of an existing garment (3D block renders, photographs, or a 2D sketch) through an intuitive interface, assisting designers in generating new concepts.

# Accessing the AI Sketchbook Space


There are two ways to access the AI Sketchbook Space

## 01

While viewing a style render image, click the 'AI Sketchbook' icon. This opens the ideation space and loads the current style as a reference image.

## 02

In the Stylezone main page, click 'AI Sketchbook' from the left navigation panel or access from the style page.



# How to Use AI Sketchbook

## Step 1

Describe your idea. Upload an image, whether a sketch, photo, or a 3D garment reference, and a text description. Supported formats: JPG, JPEG, PNG.

## Step 2

You have an option to select the garment category and the fabric type to fine-tune your input.

## Step 3

Set the imagination level. Move the slider to define how creative the AI should be –from subtle variations to bold ideas.

## Step 4

Define how many images to generate: 1, 4, or 8.

## Step 5


Choose Image Style: photorealistic or a 2D sketch.

## Step 6

View AI-generated ideas in the center panel.

## Step 7

Revisit previous ideas from the right panel.



# Writing a Description

Prompt writing is iterative. Start simple, then refine



Use subject, medium, and style as a base.



Add a minimum of 1–2 keywords at a time.



Word order matters – keywords at the beginning have more weight.



Adjust keyword weight with syntax like (keyword:1.2) or use () and [].

[keyword]: 0.9 | [[keyword]]: 0.81 | [[[keyword]]]: 0.73

(keyword): 1.1 | ((keyword)): 1.21 | (((keyword))) : 1.33

# Best Practices & Limitations

Follow these recommendations to ensure the most accurate and visually consistent results when uploading or creating design images:

## 01 Use Simple, Clear Poses

- Select reference images with arms down.
- Avoid complex poses that cover or distort parts of the garment.
- The clearer the garment in the image, the better the output.

## 02 Upload One Image at a Time

- Use a single view per image.
- Do not combine multiple views (e.g., front and side views). Combined images may confuse the system.

## 03 Preserve the Original Silhouette

- At this stage, silhouette modifications (e.g., adding pockets or altering garment shapes) are not supported.
- The system will maintain the garment's original outline and style.

## 04 Avoid Visual Obstructions

- Keep hands, accessories, props, and text away from the garment.
- Use clean, centered images for optimal results.

## 05 Let the AI Identify the Garment

- The model automatically detects garment types (e.g., shirt, skirt, jacket).
- Make sure the garment type is visually clear in the image.

## 06 For Black & White Outputs

- Use black & white input images if you want a monochrome result.
- At this stage, the model will not remove existing colors from color images.

# Viewing AI-Generated Ideas

The center panel of the ideation space shows AI-generated garments, and you can choose which ones to include in your new style.

01

Click 'Add Variation' to create more ideas.

02

Use 'View Settings' to reload your previous inputs.

03

Select the images you want to include in your style.
